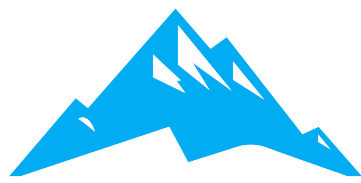

ITINERARY IN DETAIL

Day 1: Arrival in Kathmandu (1,400m)

Welcome to Nepal! Upon your arrival at Tribhuvan International Airport, our representative will greet you and transfer you to your hotel in the heart of Kathmandu. In the evening, explore the lively streets of Thamel, known for its vibrant markets, cafes, and colorful shops.

Day 2: Kathmandu Sightseeing & Flight to Paro – Transfer to Thimphu (2,334m)

Start your day with a guided tour of two UNESCO World Heritage Sites:

- **Boudhanath Stupa** – One of the largest stupas in the world and a major center of Tibetan Buddhism.
- **Pashupatinath Temple** – Nepal's most sacred Hindu temple, located on the banks of the Bagmati River.

Later, take a scenic flight from Kathmandu to Paro, Bhutan. Upon arrival, drive to Bhutan's charming capital, Thimphu, and check in at your hotel.

Day 3: Thimphu Sightseeing

Discover the cultural gems of Thimphu:

- **Tashichho Dzong** – An impressive fortress and administrative center.
- **Buddha Dordenma** – A massive 51m golden statue overlooking the valley.
- **Folk Heritage Museum** – Showcasing Bhutan's traditional lifestyle, crafts, and household items.

Enjoy Bhutanese cuisine and the serene pace of life in the capital city.

Day 4: Drive from Thimphu to Punakha via Dochula Pass (3,100m)

Journey through the scenic Dochula Pass, known for its panoramic Himalayan views and 108 memorial chortens. On arrival in Punakha, visit:

- **Punakha Dzong** – A magnificent fortress at the confluence of two rivers.
- **Chimi Lhakhang** – A fertility temple dedicated to the "Divine Madman," Lama Drukpa Kunley.

Day 5: Punakha to Phobjikha Valley (2,900m)

Drive to the pristine Phobjikha Valley, a glacial valley famous for its natural beauty and as the winter home of the rare Black-necked cranes (best seen Nov–Feb).

- Visit Gangtey Monastery – An important Nyingma monastery.
- Explore the Black-Necked Crane Center to learn about conservation efforts.

Day 6: Phobjikha to Paro (2,200m)

Take a scenic drive back to Paro, passing traditional Bhutanese villages and farmlands. Relax in Paro and enjoy the peaceful atmosphere.

Day 7: Hike to Tiger's Nest Monastery (Paro Taktsang – 3,120m)

Embark on a memorable hike to Tiger's Nest Monastery, Bhutan's most iconic landmark. This sacred site clings to a cliff and offers stunning views and spiritual vibes. The 4–5 hour round-trip trek is moderately challenging but rewarding.

Day 8: Explore Paro & Flight to Kathmandu

Visit:

- **National Museum of Bhutan (Ta Dzong)** – Showcasing Bhutanese history and artifacts.
- **Kyichu Lhakhang** – One of the oldest temples in Bhutan, dating back to the 7th century.

Later, fly back to Kathmandu and transfer to your hotel.

Day 9: Sightseeing in Kathmandu

Swayambhunath Stupa (Monkey Temple)

Swayambhunath, also known as the Monkey Temple, is one of Kathmandu's most sacred Buddhist sites. Perched on a hilltop, it offers stunning panoramic views of the city. The stupa, adorned with Buddha's all-seeing eyes, symbolizes enlightenment. Colorful prayer flags flutter in the wind, creating a peaceful spiritual atmosphere. Pilgrims walk around the stupa spinning prayer wheels, chanting mantras. The temple complex includes shrines, statues, and playful monkeys. It is a perfect place to experience Nepal's blend of Buddhism and Hinduism, making it a must-visit cultural landmark in Kathmandu.

Kathmandu Durbar Square

Kathmandu Durbar Square is a historic palace complex showcasing Nepal's rich cultural heritage. Once the royal residence of the Malla and Shah kings, it is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The square features exquisite pagoda-style temples, intricate wood carvings, and the famous Kumari Ghar, home to the living goddess Kumari. Key attractions include Hanuman Dhoka Palace, Taleju Temple, and Kasthamandap, the legendary wooden temple. The bustling courtyards and vibrant street life reflect Kathmandu's ancient charm. A visit to Durbar Square offers a glimpse into Nepal's royal history and architectural brilliance.

FAQ

1. Do I need a visa to visit Bhutan?

Yes, all international travelers (except Indian, Bangladeshi, and Maldivian nationals) require a Bhutan visa. The visa will be arranged by our travel partner in Bhutan and is included in your tour package.

2. What is the best time to take the 10-day Bhutan tour?

The best time to visit Bhutan is during spring (March–May) and autumn (September–November) when the weather is clear and ideal for sightseeing, hiking, and experiencing festivals.

3. How difficult is the hike to Tiger's Nest Monastery?

The hike to Tiger's Nest (Paro Taktsang) is moderately challenging and takes around 4–5 hours round-trip. Horses are available for hire up to a halfway point for those needing assistance.

4. Is airfare from Kathmandu to Bhutan included in the tour?

Yes, the Kathmandu to Paro round-trip flight is included in our tour package unless otherwise stated. We handle all ticketing and arrangements.
