As you venture deeper into the jungle, you may witness gharial crocodiles basking on the banks of the Rapti River, langurs leaping through the Sal trees, and peacocks calling in the early morning light. The park's varied landscape and its incredible biodiversity offer photographers, bird watchers, and wildlife lovers a rare opportunity to experience nature at its most raw and untamed.

The tour takes you to the heart of Sauraha, a charming riverside village inhabited by the Tharu people, one of Nepal's oldest indigenous communities. Walking through the village gives you an authentic look into their day-to-day lives, traditional homes made of mud and straw, and the artistic spirit expressed through dances, music, and storytelling. When is the Best Time to Visit Chitwan Safari?



The best season for the Chitwan Jungle Safari Tour runs from late September to early June. From October to March, the days are warm and sunny, ideal for wildlife sightings and outdoor activities. April and May bring hotter weather, often luring more animals to waterholes, making these months especially good for photography. The monsoon season, which lasts from mid-June to mid-September, is less favorable due to heavy rains, although the forest becomes beautifully green and lush. For clear skies, vibrant jungle life, and cultural programs in full swing, the dry months provide the most rewarding experience.

Getting to Chitwan National Park

Traveling to Chitwan is convenient and scenic. You can reach the park by tourist bus, private car, or a short domestic flight from Kathmandu or Pokhara. The overland drive, lasting about five to six hours, offers beautiful views of terraced hills, rivers, and rural settlements. Flights to Bharatpur, the nearest airport, take just 25 minutes and are ideal for those with limited time. ITINERARY IN DETAIL

Day 1: Arrive to Sauraha and transfer to Resort

Today you will arrive in Chitwan and stay at Sahara. We will enjoy lunch and go on a jungle safari. Then our guide will explain the itinerary for the next day and you can manage accordingly. We will have a delicious dinner with an amazing environment and a view of the national park. Then we will enjoy the cultural program of Tharu communities.

Time:

- 01:00 PM Reach to hotel.
- 02:00 PM Lunch.
- 03:00 PM Elephant ride (Jungle safari), visit the Tharu village.
- 06:00 PM Dinner.
- 07:00 PM Cultural Program of Tharu people.

(Jeep Safari is available for those who are afraid of elephant rides)

Day 2: Enjoy all the activities in National Park

Today we will have breakfast and move for bird watching. Then we will go for a canoe trip in the Rapti river. We will watch crocodiles and several birds in that area. We will also visit the elephant breeding farm and enjoy the elephant bath. Then we will take an elephant ride and see the observation tower. After that, we will move towards a one-horned rhino and tiger hunting tour.

- 07:00 AM Breakfast.
- 08:00 AM Birdwatch in the national park.
- 09:00 AM Canoe trip in Rapti river(watch the crocodiles, Gharials and birds).
- 10:00 AM Elephant bath and visit to Elephant breeding farm.
- 11:30 AM Elephant ride and a visit to the observation tower.
- 01:30 AM Lunch.
- 03:00 AM Visit to one-horned rhino and tiger hunting area.
- 07:00 AM Dinner

Day 3: Final Day (Bird watching in morning)

Today, we will wake up early and go for bird-watching. After a refreshing time, we will enjoy our breakfast and move towards Kathmandu.

7. When is the best time to do the Chitwan Jungle Safari?

The best time to visit is from October to March, when the weather is pleasant and ideal for outdoor exploration. April and May can be hot but are excellent for wildlife viewing near water sources. Monsoon season (June to September) is lush but may affect some activities due to heavy rain.

8. How do I get to Chitwan National Park from Kathmandu or Pokhara?

You can reach Chitwan by tourist bus, private car, or domestic flight. The drive takes about 5 to 6 hours, while a flight from Kathmandu to Bharatpur takes just 25 minutes. We offer transportation options from both Kathmandu and Pokhara for your convenience.



9. Is the Chitwan Jungle Safari safe for families and children?

Yes, it is absolutely safe for families and children. All jungle activities are led by experienced guides and naturalists who follow strict safety protocols. Canoe rides, elephant visits, and cultural shows are particularly popular with kids.

10. What animals can I see during the Chitwan Jungle Safari?

The Chitwan National Park is famous for sightings of one-horned rhinoceroses, Royal Bengal tigers, wild elephants, sloth bears, gharial crocodiles, leopards, and over 540 species of birds. While spotting a tiger is rare, rhinos, deer, wild boars, and monkeys are commonly seen during jeep safaris and jungle walks.
